

### **Petition to the Home Secretary:**

The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children **SPUC** is inviting us to sign a petition to uphold the right of peaceful, law-abiding pro-life citizens to save the lives of unborn children and to offer help to pregnant women directly outside abortion clinics and to reject any measure to restrict this activity. The offer of help from a caring pro-life person is a lifeline for many women, who feel abortion is their only choice. Pro-life citizens have a right to gather peacefully and women have a right to receive accurate information. Buffer zones would set a dangerous precedent for freedom of speech in the UK. Petition forms are available in the porches of our churches. May I encourage your good selves to sign this petition. This peaceful witness literally saves lives, a witness that is both pro-life and pro-eternal life. The witness of pro-lifers had a huge effect on Abby Johnson, the director of a key Planned Parenthood in Texas. Abby made friends with the vigil keepers outside the clinic and the Holy Spirit began to work. Abby realised for years she had told people lies, having learned the truth and faced the secrets of her own past she went on to become a leading voice for life and women in crisis. We too are called to be ambassadors for the Gospel of life!

On Monday we celebrate the feast of the **Exaltation of the Cross**, the feast recalls three events. First, the finding of the true cross by Saint Helena. Second, the dedication in 335AD of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary, the cross was brought outside the church on 14<sup>th</sup> September. Third, the restoration of the true cross to Jerusalem in 629AD by the Byzantine emperor Heraclius. **On Tuesday we keep the memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows or Dolours; her seven sorrows are: The prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of Jesus in the temple, Mary's meeting with Jesus carrying the Cross, the Crucifixion, Mary receiving her son's body and the burial of her son and tomb closing.**

Michael and James, **Haunton** shall be open for **TWO** hours on Fridays, 10:30am to 12:30 (Holy Mass: 11am) and Sundays, 8:30am to 10:30am (Holy Mass: 9am).

Dear Parishioners,

Greetings on this **Twenty-Fourth Sunday of the Church year!** The Gospel this weekend underlines the importance of forgiveness. We pray frequently in the Lord's prayer: forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. To forgive others is a Divine imperative. – easier said than done especially when we have been deeply hurt or deceived. If we refuse to forgive we frustrate the will of God for ourselves and the other person. Our heart may harden and we may end up consumed by bitterness and resentment. Hate begets hate, love begets love. Remember Jesus cried out to His Father to forgive His torturers. There was discussion in the Jewish Talmud as to the precise number of times forgiveness should be rendered unconditionally, opinions suggested three times. Jesus teaches forgiveness must be from the heart and without limits. A decision to forgive is a grace-filled moment.

As we are not bound by the obligation to attend Sunday Mass parishioners may prefer to attend a weekday Mass where numbers are fewer - family / households should try to keep at least a metre apart from others, gel hands on entering and exiting and please wear a face covering, **mandatory in enclosed places**, there are plenty of free face masks in the porch and entrance areas of our churches. **To allay real concerns may I prayerfully request those who wish to receive on the tongue directly from the priest to wait until everyone else attending Mass has received Holy Communion on their hands. **Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship states that churches should assist NHS Track and Trace by keeping a record of those who come to Church**, thus the Archdiocese of Birmingham recommends we capture contact details: name and phone number of those attending (individuals and families are free to decline) and in line with **GDPR, kept for 21 days and then disposed of.** *I realise some parishioners will wish to remain at home especially if they are either feeling ill, suspect they are ill, have been exposed to Covid 19, have a pre-existing condition, are immuno-compromised, or have a sick family member in their household.*

Half the money raised by each cyclist/walker/driver is to be returned to their home church.
